This workshop begins to unpack science-aligned interventions for both children and adults to create regulated spaces in child care programs. Providers will practice the key relational skills of co-regulation and reframing of behavior to strengthen a provider's response to children's stress behavior.

- **Behavior Guidance with Infants and Toddlers**

Participants will understand what Container Baby Syndrome is and how the excessive use of containers can lead to developmental delays in babies.

- **Transitions**, 2.5 hours (training topics 1, 3)
Transitions should be looked at as a continuation of the day not as a disruption between activities. This training will provide child care providers with ways to create transitions that work for everyone. It will allow providers to reflect on their own transition practices and support them as they find new ways to guide children from one activity to the next in a productive manner.
- **Developmentally Appropriate Practice**, 3 hours (training topic 1, 3)
Together we will identify the 5 key areas of DAP, discuss the roles of the Provider in supporting child development for each age group, look at how to ensure learning experiences that incorporate culturally relevant content that is supported by DAP, as well as exploring and observing routines, assessments and lessons plan to recognize DAP.
- **ACES 301**, 3 hours (training topics 1, 3, 10)
Apply the science of ACES 101 and the strategies of ACES 201 to create regulated spaces in your childcare program. You need to have completed ACES 101 and 201 prior to attending this program.
- **Mindfulness Matters (Wyoming County)**, 2 hours (training topics 1, 3, 10)
Learn to incorporate calm and focus with your Infants and Toddlers. Explore ways to include mindfulness techniques for both you and the children your care for. Teach the children self-care and regulating skills early on. Training will also demonstrate how to use various mindfulness materials with Infants and Toddlers. Registration is limited.
- **Healthy Sexual Development**, 2 hours (training topic 1)
This training focuses on supporting the development of healthy relationships and secure attachments - the prerequisites for healthy sexual development. As this training is designed for infant and toddler providers, the majority of the training targets the actions of caregivers and their interactions with infants and toddlers - how those actions and interactions affect healthy relationship development. The training strives to shift the perspective of caregivers to help deepen an understanding of respectful relationships with the children in their care and takes time to build skills in this area.

- **Module 1: Social Emotional Development within the Context of Relationships**
 - Understanding the importance of social emotional development and how it unfolds during the infant and toddler years.
 - What is social emotional development?
 - Considering the foundational nature of early relationship experiences.
 - Forming and maintaining relationships with your young children, families and co-workers.
 - Identifying responsive care giving strategies adults can use to support infants and toddlers.
- **Module 2: Responsive Routines, Environments, and Targeted Strategies**
 - Identifying ways a high-quality supportive environment can promote social emotional development in infants and toddlers.
 - Exploring how the environment can help provide support and prevent challenging behavior.
 - Targeted strategies to enhance social emotional well-being of infants and toddlers.
 - Understanding the positive impact of responsive caregiving routines and well-designed learning environments.
